Storm Preparedness Guide for Marine Vessels



PRIOR TO HURRICANE SEASON

Growers can make preparations to minimize losses due to extreme weather

- Ensure insurance is current and review policy for coverage. Update if needed
- Maintain vessel and trailer in working order. Maintain extra supplies (i.e., batteries)
- O Combine, duplicate, and secure vessel documents (i.e., insurance, boat registration, engine details)
- O Compile an **inventory list** to be maintained
 on vessel and updated
 as items are removed
- O Consolidate important phone numbers (i.e., insurance, Coast Guard, and RCMP)
- Review storm preparedness and post-recovery plans with employees

HURRICANE SEASON GUIDELINES

Hurricane season occurs between June 1 to November 30

TROPICAL STORM OR HURRICANE WATCH ISSUED

Continuous tracking of the storm to evaluate next actions. Growers should avoid being on the water < 24 hr prior to landfall. After all on the water preparations are made, prepare vessels:

Trailerable Vessels

- Haul vessel, secure vessel to trailer, and store vessel / trailer in a building or an area absent of trees or debris
- Remove batteries from vessel and tow vehicle to reduce fire risk
- Place blocks at the trailer's tongue jack / wheel and fore / aft each wheel
- Remove or secure movable equipment / gear off the vessel, noting in inventory list to ensure supplies are replenished
- O Using lines / ropes to secure vessel / trailer to fixed objects or anchors

HURRICANE SEASON GUIDELINES

TROPICAL STORM OR HURRICANE WATCH ISSUED Non-Trailerable Vessels

- O Double lines to mooring or wharf; add anchors (360°) do not raft with other vessels
- **Evaluate battery function**; consider installation of a secondary battery
- O Ensure vessel's fuel is maximized and remove moveable gear / equipment

PRIOR TO LANDFALL

- Turn on automatic bilge pump(s) (marine moored); remove drain plugs (land based)
- O Document vessel condition with dated photographs or video
- O Purchase and safely store diesel for post storm recovery
- O Focus on personal preparations and protection

POST-STORM RECOVERY

- Assess accessibility of the vessel only return if conditions (i.e., wind or waves) allow
- Turn off automatic bilge pump(s) (marine moored); return drain plugs (land based)
- Take pictures or video footage and make detailed notes on the vessel condition

- Return gear / equipment removed during storm preparations
- Remove anchors and lines; launch vessel if conditions allow (i.e., functional ramp, wind, or waves)
- O Communicate
 extent of damages
 to associations and
 government bodies
